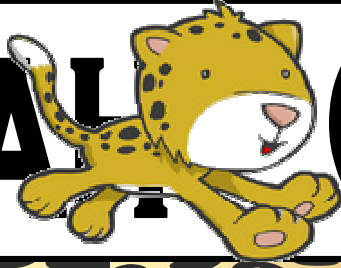

Do you want to get stronger and stay fit through the winter months?

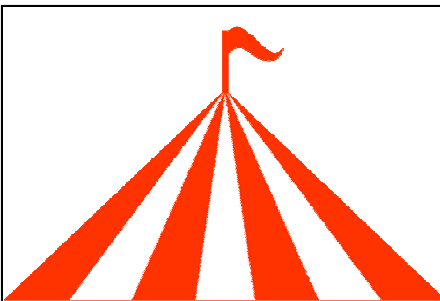
Do you want to become a great wrestler?

Like many of you, we are excited that fall is finally here. The weather is turning cooler, and the leaves are beginning to change. This change of season is an appropriate time to discuss safety precautions with your children. Days are already getting shorter and night time is arriving earlier. With the upcoming change (November 1) from Daylight Savings Time, many of our children will now leave or arrive home in the dark. It is very important that we do all we can to make sure their trip to and from school is safe and uneventful. Please remind your children to always be aware of their surroundings and to report any unusual contact they have with strangers. Encourage them to talk with you or a school staff member if something doesn't seem right in their surroundings. Many drivers are also adjusting to the time change, so children need to be especially careful when they are near busy streets.
